Day Program Support Worker, Casual

Peers Victoria Resources Society (Peers) is an innovative, multi-service grassroots agency that has been working with Victoria sex workers for close to 20 years. Through direct service delivery and partnerships, Peers provides outreach, harm reduction, and drop in services, as well as wellness workshops, housing support, and social justice leadership concerning sex workers' rights. We maintain a welcoming environment congruent with our values of providing harm reduction oriented, client-centered services which contribute to social justice and draw on experiential knowledge.

Reporting to the Executive Director, the **Day Program Worker** is skilled in harm reduction service models, familiar with local health and social services, and knowledgeable about the local sex industry. Day Program staff work collaboratively with team members to deliver ethical, peer-based, responsive support, informed by our service recipients in the drop in program and (if eligible) housing support program.

Specific duties for this position include:

- Deliver client-centred support services including harm reduction supplies, condoms, service information, and food, at the Drop-In Centre.
- Identify potential new participants for PEERS daytime programs
- Provide client-centred advocacy
- Liaise and build relationships with local service agencies
- Maintain housing lists, offer support completing housing applications, and provide referrals to housing resources
- Provide support and assistance for drop-in program participants, including assisting with computer/internet access, form completion/copying, and assist with organizing daytime wellness and recreation workshops.
- Collaborate with the VicPD Special Victims Unit and other local service agencies to compile and distribute information regarding violent incidents and offenders as it pertains to the safety of local sex workers
- Document basic statistics on all aspects of Drop-In Centre service delivery as required
- Communicate with lunch volunteers or prepare lunches in their absence
- Manage donations (sorting, tracking requests, distribution) & clothing room at Drop-In Centre
- Provide general support and maintain the general tidiness of the main office and common areas.
- Adherence to PEERS organizational policies
