**Position Summary**: Reporting to the Executive Director, the research assistant position is a casual position in support of evaluation and research activities in the organization. At this time, assistance is needed with harm reduction program evaluation (estimated 100 hours) and preparing an existing Housing First research report (estimated 40 hours) for academic journal publication. Upcoming activities may include assistance with a historical documentation project, client survey, and planning and execution of a 3-day research funded training intensive.
